This spring the provincial government announced its intention to privatize up to 23 new hospitals in Ontario through P3s - or "public private partnerships". St. Catharines new hospital is at risk of being privatized under this plan.

Highway 407 is a private public partnership. Like in the 407 deal, in a P3 hospital, the public pays for the hospital, but its services are run for profit. The private sector profits and the public pays.

We can keep our hospital public – if we act now!
